LORD, we beseech thee, grant thy people grace to withstand the temptations of the world, the flesh and the devil: and with pure hearts and minds to follow thee the only God; through Jesus Christ thy Son our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, ever one God, world without end. First reading Isaiah 5:1-7

Let me sing for my beloved a love song concerning his vineyard:

My beloved had a vineyard on a very fertile hill.

He digged it and cleared it of stones, and planted it with choice vines;

he built a watchtower in the midst of it, and hewed out a wine vat in it;

and he looked for it to yield grapes,

but it yielded wild grapes.

And now, O inhabitants of Jerusalem and men of Judah,

judge, I pray you, between me and my vineyard.

What more was there to do for my vineyard, that I have not done in it?

When I looked for it to yield grapes, why did it yield wild grapes?

And now I will tell you

what I will do to my vineyard.

I will remove its hedge,

and it shall be devoured;

I will break down its wall, and it shall be trampled down.

I will make it a waste;

it shall not be pruned or hoed, and briers and thorns shall grow up;

I will also command the clouds that they rain no rain upon it.

For the vineyard of the Lord of hosts

is the house of Israel,

and the men of Judah

are his pleasant planting; and he looked for justice, but behold, bloodshed; for righteousness, but behold, a cry!

Second reading *Philippians* 4:6-9

Brethren:

Have no anxiety about anything,

but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving

let your requests be made known to God.

And the peace of God,

which passes all understanding,

will keep your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Finally, brethren, whatever is true,

whatever is honourable, whatever is just,

whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious,

if there is any excellence,

if there is anything worthy of praise,

think about these things.

and heard and seen in me, do;

They said to him,



12th October **St. Wilfrid**



The 7th century Benedictine saint, Wilfrid, who was abbot of his community, elected bishop of York and who was a enormously talented man and influential is commemorated on 12th October. He is well-known and celebrated because of his tireless zeal for God's Kingdom. He is credited with acquiring land, building monasteries and churches (including founding Ripon Cathedral where he is buried), patronage of secular and sacred art, and for moving the Church in England from being an independent Church to one more obedient to the authority of Rome. Today we pray for the Church in England, and especially for the Benedictine communities in this land.




Remember us in heaven, Saint John Henry Newman.

As you know, Evening Prayer is prayed publicly in church **Sunday to Thursday at 5.30pm**, using Divine Worship Daily Office. Sometimes it is just me; on other occasions I'm joined by one or two people. I've recently started livestreaming it, so again there is the potential that others will join in remotely, as I know they have been doing. I'd love you to join me, either remotely or in person if you're able. I'm more and more convinced that the ordinariate Office Book is a very powerful tool in our hands – in gathering us around a very authentically Anglican liturgy and in reaching out to others and sharing a new expression of prayer. Evensong lasts about 30 minutes.

The "Synod on Synodality"

Please pray for those gathered in Rome for the "Synod on Synodality", 4th – 29th October. The prevailing ambiguity and confusion around this synod in relation to certain Church teachings is causing great concern for many. Not known for clarity and precision himself, Pope Francis has nevertheless again reminded participants that they have not been gathered to Rome to be a parliament, or to promote their own agendas or ideologies, or to plan for reformation. However, it seems that that is precisely what some people are gearing up for. One hopes and prays that they will be disappointed.



If you intend to pray daily **Morning Prayer** and **Evening Prayer**, the table below gives you the page numbers for each of the parts of the Office for each day this week. Placing the markers in the correct pages, as indicated in the table below, takes a few minutes each time, but once done, actually praying the Office is quite straight-forward.

The Order of Morning Prayer (MP) (Matins) begins on page 375

The Order of Evening Prayer (EP) (Evensong) begins on page 421

All numbers below refer to *page numbers* in Divine Worship: Daily Office (DWDO), unless otherwise indicated.

For those who are looking initially for something a little simpler, the **Office of Prime** (page 397) is a shorter form of prayer for the morning, and the **Office of Compline** (page 427) is a shorter form of prayer for the evening. These will take about 10 minutes each to pray.
