Sunday 9th April 2023 Easter Day (The Resurrection of the Lord)



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Collect

ALMIGHTY God, who through thine Only Begotten Son Jesus Christ hast overcome death, and opened unto us the gate of everlasting life: we humbly beseech thee; that as by thy special grace thou hast put into our minds good desires, so by thy continual help we may bring the same to good effect; through the same Jesus Christ thy Son our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, ever one God, world without end. Amen.

First reading Acts 10:34,37-43

In those days, Peter opened his mouth and said,

"You know the word which was proclaimed throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism which John preached: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all that were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. And we are witnesses to all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and made him manifest; not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. And he commanded us to preach to the people, and to testify that he is the one ordained by God to be judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness that every one who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

Second reading *Colossians* 3:1-4 Brethren:

If you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is our life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory.

Gospel John 20:1-9

Now on the first day of the week Mary Mag'dalene came to the tomb early, while it was still dark, and saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb. 2 So she ran, and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." 3 Peter then came out with the other disciple, and they went toward the tomb. 4 They both ran, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first; ⁵ and stooping to look in, he saw the linen cloths lying there, but he did not go in. ⁶Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb; he saw the linen cloths lying, 7 and the napkin, which had been on his head, not lying with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. ⁸ Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; 9 for as yet they did not know the scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

The Easter Anthems


Instead of the Venite the following Anthems are said at Morning Prayer on Easter Day and through the Octave.

CHRIST our Passover is sacrificed for us: therefore let us keep the feast, not with the old leaven of malice and wickedness: but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth. *Corinthians* 5:7

CHRIST being raised from the dead dieth no more: death hath no more dominion over him. For in that he died, he died unto sin once: but in that he liveth, he liveth unto God. Likewise reckon ye also yourselves to be dead indeed unto sin: but alive unto God through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Romans 6:9-11* CHRIST is risen from the dead: and become the firstfruits of them that slept. For since by man came death: by man came also the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die: even so in Christ shall all be made alive. *1Corinthians 15:20-22*

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son: and to the Holy Ghost; as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be: world without end. Amen.

Parish Visitation, 29th/30th April

As you know, Canon Paul Fitzpatrick, Episcopal Vicar for Oxfordshire, Warwickshire and Coventry, is making a Visitation to All Souls on the weekend of Saturday 29th and Sunday 30th April, as part of the Visitation of the Deanery of Coventry & Nuneaton. Canon Fitzpatrick will be attending, and preaching at, both Sunday Masses. I hope we will all be present at the 11.15 Mass, so that Canon Fitzpatrick sees how the Ordinariate is making a significant contribution to the life of the parish, and is able to meet you.

The 11.15 Mass will be celebrated according to Divine Worship, so it is even more important that we are present at full strength. As he is unfamiliar with Divine Worship, Canon Paul has asked me to celebrate the Mass, while he sits in choir. He will celebrate the 9.30 Mass.

The not-so-distant future for every deanery in this diocese and others is likely to look quite different, because of declining attendance (accelerated by the covid pandemic) and falling numbers of priests. The Visitations inevitably therefore are partly about the diocese getting a handle on reality on the ground and using that to plan for the future. **Please be here.**


Most highly favoured Lady, 2nd-4th May 2023

Praying the Daily Office this week

If you intend to pray daily **Morning Prayer** and **Evening Prayer**, the table below gives you the page numbers for each of the parts of the Office for each day this week. Placing the markers in the correct pages, as indicated in the table below, takes a few minutes each time, but once done, actually praying the Office is quite straight-forward.

The Order of Morning Prayer (MP) (Matins) begins on page 375

The Order of Evening Prayer (EP) (Evensong) begins on page 421

All numbers below refer to *page numbers* in Divine Worship: Daily Office (DWDO), unless otherwise indicated. Note: the Office hymn is always optional, but encouraged.

The Collect for Ash Wednesday is said at MP and EP daily throughout Lent, after the Collect of the day and before the Second Collect of the Office.

Weekday Collects for Lent Ferias are provided ie the Collect for the previous Sunday is not used.

The Athanasian Creed is said today (p.339), but not through the Octave.
