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Collect

ALMIGHTY God, who hast given thine only Son to be unto us both a sacrifice for sin, and also an example of godly life: give us grace that we may always most thankfully receive his inestimable benefit; and also daily endeavour ourselves to follow the blessed steps of his most holy life; through the same Jesus Christ thy Son our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, ever one God, world without end. Amen.

First reading Acts 3: 13-15, 17-19ab

In those days: Peter said to the people, "The God of Abraham and of Isaac and of Jacob, the God of our fathers, glorified his servant Jesus, whom you delivered up and denied in the presence of Pilate, when he had decided to release him. But you denied the Holy and Righteous One, and asked for a murderer to be granted to you, and killed the Author of life, whom God raised from the dead. To this we are witnesses.

"And now, brethren, I know that you acted in ignorance, as did also your rulers. But what God foretold by the mouth of all the prophets, that his Christ should suffer, he thus fulfilled. Repent therefore, and turn again, that your sins may be blotted out.

Second reading 1 John 2: 1-5a

My little children, I am writing this to you so that you may not sin; but if any one does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous; and he is the expiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world. And by this we may be sure that we know him, if we keep his commandments. He who says "I know him" but disobeys his commandments is a liar, and the truth is not in him; but whoever keeps his word, in him truly love for God is perfected.

Gospel Luke 24:35-48

At that time: the two disciples told what had happened on the road, and how Jesus was known to them in the breaking of the bread.

As they were saying this, Jesus himself stood among them, and said to them, "Peace to you." But they were startled and frightened, and supposed that they saw a spirit. And he said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do questionings rise in your hearts? See my hands and my feet, that it is I myself; handle me, and see; for a spirit has not flesh and bones as you see that I have." And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. And while they still disbelieved for joy, and wondered, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of broiled fish, and he took it and ate before them. Then he said to them, "These are my words which I spoke to you, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses and the prophets and the psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins should be preached in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things.



FORTY HOURS DEVOTION FOR PENTECOST

On Sunday 19th May we celebrate the great Solemnity of Pentecost. This year to prepare for this very important feast of the Holy Spirit we will be having a continuous 40 hour period of Eucharistic Adoration in church from 8am on Friday 17th May until midnight on Saturday 18th May, through the



night. A Forty Hours Devotion provides a wonderful opportunity for spiritual growth as individuals, and as a parish. At a time of much challenge and change in the deanery of Coventry and Nuneaton, it is very necessary for us to fall to our knees in humble adoration and pray for the gifts of the Holy Spirit to breathe new life into the parishes and to guide us to make the right decisions for the future. Our deanery conversations and plans will bear limited fruit if they're not rooted in prayer and guided by the Holy Spirit.

If you want to see the Church in our parish, our city and our deanery grow and thrive; if you want others to know and follow Christ; if you are serious about living out your Baptism and Confirmation, then please give an hour to spend before the Lord. If you would like to commit to a specific time slot, a sign-up sheet is available in church. If you're not able to be in church physically due to age or incapacity, please join the vigil spiritually from home.

What is "40 Hours Adoration"?

Jesus is truly present in the Holy Eucharist. Adoration is the word we use when the priest places the Eucharist (the consecrated Host of the Mass) on the altar for us to come and adore.

How do I "adore"?

Adoration means coming to church and sitting or kneeling in the presence of God. It usually takes place in silence. It is the chance to gaze upon our good God, to reflect, to thank God and praise him, and to share with him your concerns, joys, and sorrows.

What will I do there?


We sign up for a one-hour slot (more if you are able). The most important thing is to be there; to open your heart to God; to let Jesus touch your heart. You can also read a bit of the Bible, or pray the Rosary, or the Litany of the Holy Spirit, or the Novena to the Holy Spirit, or write down what is on your heart.

Why?

This particular 40 Hours Devotion will be dedicated to asking the Lord to send the Holy Spirit on our parishes and deanery, to guide us into a future in which we are much more dependent on him and more confident in the Gospel; to fill us with his life, and to help us bring Jesus Christ to a world so desperately in need of him.

October Parish Pilgrimage to Walsingham


Please contact Fr Paul as soon as possible if you would like to join a parish pilgrimage to the Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham 7-10 October 2024.

If you intend to pray daily **Morning Prayer** and **Evening Prayer**, the table below gives you the page numbers for each of the parts of the Office for each day this week. Placing the markers in the correct pages, as indicated in the table below, takes a few minutes each time, but once done, actually praying the Office is quite straight-forward.

The Order of Morning Prayer (MP) (Matins) begins on page 375

The Order of Evening Prayer (EP) (Evensong) begins on page 421

All numbers below refer to *page numbers* in Divine Worship: Daily Office (DWDO), unless otherwise indicated.
